CHANGES IN 2022 SOCIAL SECURITY PAYMENTS - Recap by Cindy Abraham

The biggest change beneficiaries will see in Social Security in 2022 is a 5.9 percent cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) to monthly retirement benefits as well as SSI checks. The increase is the largest since 1982. This is because prices of goods and services measured in the CPI-W have significantly increased in the past year, due in part to a rebounding economy and COVID-19 outbreaks, which have both driven up energy prices.

Although the average retirement check will go up, most beneficiaries won't see the full amount in their monthly check because Medicare Part B premiums are deducted directly from most Social Security retirement payments.

Those with the smallest Social Security benefit get hit the hardest by the Medicare increase because although Social Security COLAs have increased 18.8% from 2013 through 2022, Part B premiums have increased by 57.2% during the same period.

But unlike previous waves, we have all the tools. We continue to work around the clock to provide vaccines and booster shots. We are ramping up our testing operations. We are expecting our hospitals to receive Paxlavoid, a new pill which evidence suggests will save many lives. We have a long way to go, and it is unfortunate we were not able to conquer this pandemic while we had the chance. But we have the tools to keep our residents safe. Even as we continue to address the health issue of COVID-19, we must continue to cope with its economic repercussions. Fortunately, Broward County is well on the way to recovering and is looking towards a bright 2022. The American Rescue Plan Act and Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill offer us the opportunity to make critical investments in the future of our County. We have serious needs, particularly for infrastructure supporting the environment, in transportation, in solid waste, in our arts and culture scene, and in early childhood education. These areas will allow receive significant investment from multiple funding sources in 2022. We will put our County back to work and pave the road for a brighter future.

the pandemic – emissions are now back where they were before the shutdown. Broward County has released its latest update to the Climate Change Action Plan – the first since 2015. This update incorporates contributions from scientists, experts, elected officials, business leaders, and residents like you to create the most sustainable and resilient Broward County. This includes priority flood maps, a solid waste system, seawalls, new electric buses, new electric vehicle charging stations, purple piping and clean water facilities, and much, much more. It is critical we make the investments needed to restore and improve this critical industry. These are not the only issues we will face in 2022. We are going to bring our community together around great ideas in 2022 - from improving our Airport and Port, to increasing ballot access in the 2022 election, to creating more affordable housing opportunities, and much more in-between. Hello Meighbor!



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January Kitchen Korner - by Cindy Abraham *****

AIR FRYER RECIPES

Get one! It saves you a lot on electricity and clean-up is a breeze! Whenever we make ANYTHING, we ask ourselves if we should try cooking it in the air fryer. Vegetables are a big "hell yes"! And not just French fries. Any kind of fish is great in it. The drawer styles are the best. We have a Ninja that we like.



My daughter bought a Cosori which is bigger than my Ninja and she even makes pork chops in it. Just Google anything you are thinking of cooking and if the recipe works better in the air fryer than in the oven, you will get instructions.

We always put anything that would normally be fried in oil in the air fryer but now we have branched out and use it instead of broiling for 6 oz. lobster tails. They came out PERFECT. Our air fryer won't hold more than 3 because there are only two of us, but they cook so fast two batches don't take long.

1. Butterfly the lobster tail. Cut through the top of the lobster lengthwise but not all the way through to the shell. Spread the shell apart and using your fingers, gently pull the lobster meat so it sits on top of the shell but still connected at the end. Rinse the meat off and remove any vein.

2. Mix together any type of butter baste to your liking. Melt butter with garlic powder, parsley, lemon juice – whatever you like. Make sure you have at least $\frac{1}{2}$ cup.

3. Season the lobster with salt and pepper. (Smoked paprika is good too). Then coat both sides of the lobster meat with the butter sauce.

4. Place lobster tails in the air fry and cook at 380 degrees for 4 minutes. Baste with more butter and cook for another 4 minutes. Check the bottom – you may need another minute or so.

5. Serve with additional butter sauce and lemon wedges.

OR if you want to broil them in the oven, preheat to broil, put the lobster on a baking sheet and baste them before you put them in the oven. Cook for 5-10 minutes and baste them again halfway through.

Tyson makes air fry chicken breasts and they make a GREAT sandwich. If you want some killer honey mustard, go to Publix, and look on the top shelf of the mustard section for Honeycup Mustard (\$5.01 per jar but worth it). Put 2 breasts in the air fryer for 12 minutes. Toast a bun and spread with honey mustard. When the chicken is done, put it on the bun. Easy peasy. I put fresh spinach on all our sandwiches just to add some healthy.

As many of you know, any Hillcrester can call my partner Brian when needing advice about repairs or remodel issues. Often, he can fix it himself or he knows who they should call if it is something more complicated. He helped our neighbor Mimi with a small repair and as a thank you she gave him an applesauce cake.

It was OVER THE TOP, OFF THE CHAIN DELICIOUS! I begged her for the recipe which turns out to be one of those that goes back generations and Mimi graciously gave me the OK to share. I made it myself and used ¼ of the ingredients. I didn't have raisins so use Craisins soaked in strong turmeric tea and Triple-Sec liqueur. Mimi uses Crisco shortening and I used canola oil. Bottom line: her cake was better.

Here is the back story: "I am so happy to share this family recipe. It started with a recipe from the New York cookbook that the children's grandmother would always send at Christmas time. When she was no longer able to do that, I took over the duties and it became our family tradition. We start baking the cakes before Thanksgiving and continue through the holidays.

The secret to this recipe is the soaking solution for the raisins. Since they are already VERY plump when they are added to the batter, they no longer absorb the moisture from the cake, but rather add to the taste and the rich moisture of the cake. The cakes can be preserved in the freezer for several weeks, and when the cake becomes a little dry, slice a few pieces, put them in the toaster for a very light toast, add cream cheese and enjoy!

This recipe makes at least 3 large loaf pans and a few cupcakes. For family baking using half of the recipe is normally enough."

SOAK RAISINS AT LEAST OVERNIGHT, in a solution of strong tea (regular or raspberry) and rum, whiskey or other sweet liquor to make one cup. Save the solution when you drain the raisins the next day.

APPLESAUCE CAKE

5 cups of flour, 4 cups of sugar


- 3 tsp baking soda, 3 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1 ½ tsp cinnamon, 1 tsp allspice
- 1 tsp ground cloves, 1 cup applesauce

1 cup shortening, 4 eggs, 2 cups raisins (Don't forget to soak the raisins and reserve

1 cup of the liquid.)

- 1 cup soaking solution (above), 1 cup pecan pieces
- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Mix all DRY ingredients together in a large bowl
- 3. Add applesauce, tea solution, shortening and eggs. Blend well with a mixer.
- 4. Stir in raisins & pecans.
- 5. Pour into well-greased and floured loaf pans
- 6. Bake 50 minutes to an hour. Smaller size loaf pans will cook faster.
- 7. Check after 40 minutes and adjust cooking time accordingly.

8. Let cool at least 30 minutes before removing from pan. Slice and enjoy!



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

Automatic Senior Exemption Renewals for 2022

Beginning this year (2022), after the initial application approval, the Senior Exemption automatically renews each year unless the senior notifies our office that they no longer meet the income requirement for this exemption. People who received the Senior Exemption in 2021 and are

still living at the same address do not need to send in a signed renewal card to continue receiving this exemption.

Our office will mail the Senior Exemption renewal information later this month with the annual income limitation set by the state of Florida.

If your 2021 adjusted household gross income does not exceed the amount set by the state for the 2022 tax year, you DO NOT need to do anything to continue receiving this valuable exemption for 2022. Your exemption will automatically be renewed provided you are still living at the same address and receiving Homestead Exemption. If your 2021 adjusted household gross income did exceed the income limitation, you must notify our office that you no longer qualify for this tax year when you receive the annual income notification from our office. We understand the adjusted household gross income for some individuals may change from year to year so an applicant may qualify one year and then not the next.

If you did not receive the Senior Exemption for 2021 and you believe you may qualify, please visit our website at web.bcpa.net and click on the "Senior Exemption" icon to view this exemption and all the other exemptions available to qualified applicants. You can also apply online at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/SeniorsAppForm. The deadline to apply for any 2022 exemption is September 19, 2022.



DECEMBER 2021 STATE OF THE MARKET REPORT

Not sure why closed sales are low toward the holidays. With inventory so tight, if I were a buyer, this is the time I would be out shopping – not so much competition. But only 10 closed sales were recorded for the month of December. Stats can be misinterpreted because although there do not seem to be many low or mid rise sales, it is because there are not that many on the market. There is no longer a difference in prices between all age and over-55 buildings. The 12 pending sales are split 50-50 between one and two bedroom units. Nine are over-55 units and 3 all age; 10 are in the high rises and two in the low/mid rises.

There are only a couple of buildings that do not sell as well as others and that is because one is not very clean or well-maintained (chipped paint on the doors, smelly trash rooms, etc.), and the other has a property manager who doesn't know how to process an application. Before you hire a property manager for your building, at least contact the Hillcrest Leadership Council. We can't recommend any but we can tell you who NOT to hire and give you solid reasons why. All buildings have a reputation and it doesn't take long for Realtors to start avoiding problem buildings.

In the last issue I predicted that seven of the then active listings would have to take a price reduction. Two did reduce the price and the other five are still on the market.

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

HOW ELIZABETH GILBERT LEARNED TO TRANSFORM SUFFERING INTO GROWTH YOU CAN LET LIFE'S INEVITABLE TORMENTS CUT YOU DOWN-OR YOU CAN USE THEM TO GROW. BY ELIZABETH GILBERT

Many years ago, I met a man named Jim MacLaren, who had one of the most extraordinary life stories I'd ever heard. Jim had come into manhood with all the promise in the world: He'd been an ambitious student at Yale and was a talented athlete and handsome young actor in training. Then one beautiful fall evening in New York City—one of those shimmering, velvety nights, he said, when everything seems possible—he was hit by a bus and lost part of his leg. But Jim was a survivor, and so he overcame his loss and transformed himself into a champion marathoner and Ironman athlete.

Inspiring, right? But wait-it doesn't end there.

Several years later, Jim was competing in a triathlon. Despite his prosthetic leg, he was far ahead of many of his more able-bodied competitors, leading a pack of speeding bicyclists down a stretch of road that was supposed to be closed for the race. A van, which was mistakenly allowed to pass through the intersection, hit Jim and instantly broke his neck. Now the amputee was a quadriplegic.

Suddenly it's not such an inspiring story. Suddenly it's a horrifying story, one that raises all sorts of unanswerable questions about life and suffering and injustice. After the second accident, Jim awoke in the hospital enraged at his dilemma. What now, what do I do?

Jim's story goes so far beyond the realm of "fair" that it knocks the breath right out of you. Why would a good man be put through such torment?

We've all seen this happen. Destiny starts raining down hammers on somebody and will not let up. Just when your friend's cancer is in remission, her house burns down. On the same day your sister gets fired, her husband walks out on her. The surprise tax bill arrives just a few hours before your mother's funeral. Sometimes it's one catastrophe after another. You don't know whether you should duck, weep, run screaming, or just start punching in all directions.

When I face a catastrophe of my own, I remember Jim MacLaren. After he broke his neck, he fell into depression and drug addiction. But a spirit in this man kept reaching for the light—a spirit of divine curiosity, which pushed him to ask, "Who am I now, after I've lost everything?" By the time I met Jim, he'd answered that question. Peaceful in his wheelchair, he radiated certainty that his entire purpose (indeed, his entire identity) was to live in a state of unconditional love. I asked him whether he thought his suffering had transformed him into a better person. "Absolutely," he said. I asked whether suffering always transforms people into a better version of themselves. "Not necessarily," he said. Jim explained to me that suffering is one of the most powerful energy forces in the universe—but only if you use it as an instrument of change. People must be willing to journey all the way to the bottom of their pain and experience full catharsis—to completely break apart so they can then rebuild themselves anew. As Jim said, "Suffering without catharsis is nothing but wasted pain."

He said the world is filled with people who have suffered horribly and crawled away broken. They never reached catharsis; they just got shattered and stayed shattered. And then there are the great masters (Gandhi, Mandela, King) who used their suffering as an incredible engine to transform into something better. Jim MacLaren taught me never to waste my pain—he taught me to enter straight into it with divine curiosity instead of running from it. And if you can learn to do that? Honestly, my friends, you can do anything.
